Remarks Recommend Payment of claims in this case, the amount payable have been considerably more if a claim had been made for all the damage done.

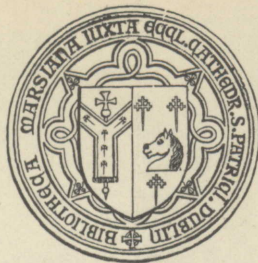

the books burnt at Mess^r Thom's premises, I have to say
that I have already sent details to Mess^r Thom & also to
your Committee when at the Star Building in College Green.
To begin with there were 4 vols (one bound) of the Parish
Register Society publications - the last 4, new - for which
we recently paid about £4.10.
15 rare pamphlets, not yet catalogued, to form 3 vols.

and about 23 other vols, large and small, all of
them rare, some unique and impossible to replace.

The value of these things to a library such as this is
not to be gauged by what the man in the street would sell
them for. Still, I had the man in the street in my mind
when I claimed only £16 for the damage done to this
library. I did not mention irreparable injury done to a beautiful
oak door rent in 6 or 7 places by large bullet holes.
