



MEMORANDUM.

BOVRIL LIMITED.

The Military Authorities took possession of the Claimants premises, and distributed portions of their Stock amongst the public in order to alleviate the distress prevailing at the time.

Messrs Bovril made a claim upon the Military Authorities for £ 1340 - 17 - 9. The Food Supply Committee arranged for payment to the extent of £ 618 - 18 - 0, but items in the Claim to the extent of £ 721 - 19 - 9 were rejected by that Committee upon the ground that the evidence was inadequate.

The following is a copy of the receipt given by the Military Authorities to the Claimants:-

It was in regard to the 641 dozen 1 oz. bottles of Bovril and 607 dozen of 2 oz. bottles of Bovril, that the Food Supply Committee acknowledged liability.

It is in regard to the "further quantities" mentioned in the above receipt which the Military state they were unable to estimate, that the Food Supply Committee repudiate liability. The loss upon the further quantities mentioned in the receipt, amounts to £559 - 15 - 0

as shown in our Report.

We have carried on a correspondence with the Local Government Board and with the Military Authorities in regard to the matter, but as will be seen from the copies of correspondence attached hereto, both these Bodies deny liability.
