The Military Authorities took possession of the Claimants premises, and distributed portions of their Stock amongst the public in order to alleviate the distress prevailing at the time.

Messrs Bolril made a claim upon the Military Authorities for £ 1340 - 17 - 9. The Food Supply Committee arranged for payment to the extent of £ 618 - 18 - 0, but items in the Claim to the extent of £ 721 - 19 - 9 were rejected by that Committee upon the ground that the evidence was inadequate.

We have carried on a correspondence with the Local Government Board and with the Military Authorities in regard to the matter, but as will be seen from the copies of correspondence attached hereto, both these Bodies deny liability.

Dear Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 14th June last addressed to Messrs Bovril Limited, 14, Eustace Street, in which you admitted liability for £ 618 - 18 - 0, but repudiated liability for £ 721 - 19 - 9 for goods alleged to be requisitioned by the Military Authorities, we will thank you to inform us your reason for refusing to admit liability for this item.

We have before us a copy of the receipt dated the 29th April given by Lieutenant Norman for 341 dozen of 1 ez. bottles of Bevril and 307 dozen of 2 ez. bottles of Bevril. At foot of the receipt there is a clause as follows:-

"Further quantities which we are at present unable to estimate, have been delivered to the public by Sergeant Dunn in charge of the Picket by order of Captain Kelly." Signed H.W. Norman, Lieutenant.

We understand that it is in regard to these further quantities that Messrs Bovril have now made a claim on the Property Losses (Ireland)

Committee 1916, of £ 721 - 19 - 9.

On investigation the Committee accepted responsibility for goods to the value of £618. 18. Which were distributed by the Military during the Rebellion period, and a cheque for that amount has been issued by the Food Supply Committee to Messrs Bovril, Ltd. There was no evidence to support any further claim of the firm against the Food Supply Committee.

In reply the Board direct me to state that they understand from the Food Supply Committee that the claim for £1340. 17. 9. was forwarded to the Military Authorities at their request. The Food Supply Committee arranged for payment for goods to the extent of £618. 18. 0. which were vouched for by the order of the Military Officer who requisitioned the food, the remainder of the clam being rejected by the Committee as the evidence in support of it was entirely inadequate. It included such articles as fountain pens, thermos flasks, and playing cards which were outside the province of the Committee.
