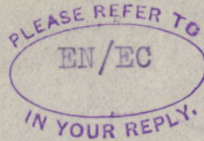



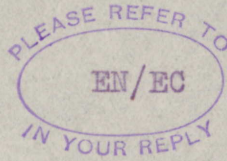

Re Insurance. We have a Policy against Fire which only covers the goods during transit by Sea, and we have therefore no Claim against the Company.

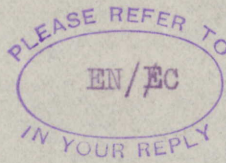

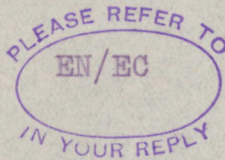

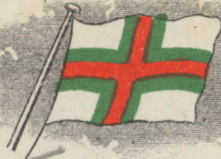
