Inspector's Report.

Claim No. 1262.

Name of Claimant Mrs. Mary Josephine Gleeson and Mrs. Catherine J. Ennis. Occupation Market Gardeners.

Situation of Property Richmond Hill House, Kilmainham, Dublin.

Interests in the buildings

The Claimants are sisters, and have about 15 Irish acres under vegetables at the address named. They hold portion of the land under lease and portion as freehold. I interviewed Mrs. Gleeson, and subsequently Mr. W. J. Gleeson, B.L., also Mr. J. Ennis (husband of second named Claimant). The latter really works the market gardening business, and he states that the claim of £45 is made up on a rough estimate of 800 doz. Cabbages @ 6d. per doz., with 100,000 Cabbage plants @ 5/- per thousand. In regard to the Seed Cabbages which were on the ground he had to replace what was taken by 3 st. weight purchased from Sir James Mackay, Seed Merchant, at a cost of over £10. The property is situate near Wellington Barracks, and the cabbages were looted, being taken at random from various places in the field, and it is practically impossible to arrive at a correct computation of Claimants' actual loss. I have put it down at £30, which would, I believe, fairly compensate. Taking Mr. Ennis's estimate of the quantity of Cabbages taken -(800 doz.) - the price at the Market this week would not be £20, there being an overcrowding in this class of vegetable.
