Dear Sir.

I have received a payment of 14E against my claim for loss caused by the burning of the Imperial Botel Dublin in Easter Week 1916, and must protest against this paltry attempt at settlement, I therefore wish to place the circumstances before you again and hope that you will see your way to reconsider my claim and advise a more equitable settlement. I was in Dublin on the invitation of the Royal Society in connection with the show at Balls Bridge, and as I had not been well for some time, it was my intention having a months holiday in Ireland and consequently had more clothes with me than would have had in the ordinary way, had it not been for my appointment at the slow I would not have been in Dublin at all, and do not think it is fair that I should have to stand the loss.

I might mention that when I came to repurchase I had to pay more money for worse articles.
