During the recent insurrection in Dublin on the evening of the 29th April my premises at the above address were seriously damaged by shell and rifle fire - said fire being directed at the Dispensary to dislodge the Insurgents, viz:-

I. a.c.h.

Hall Door shattered by shell

II Sample

Front iron railing shattered by shell

J.K.T.

Cement on Gable and on front of building dislodged by bullets,

18. V. 16.

Windows of shop and dwelling house shattered by rifle fire,

The following repairs are absolutely necessary:-

A new Hall door complete,
