Re our Claim No. 145.

Confirming interview we had with you yesterday. The total amount of our claim is £36. 1. 2. and the paying order, received in full discharge of our claim is for £27. 19. 2. only.

Now, we would respectfully point out that every item claimed for was put down at exact cost. Estimates, Receipts and Price Lists were shown to the Assessor, and so far as we know he has been quite satisfied, but if there is anything on which he is not, we shall only be too pleased to go further into the matter.

The unfortunate part of the whole thing is, we have not been able to replace the goods looted except at a much advanced price, and in the case of Messrs. Heggie & Lockhart's estimate, we had not got it when the claim was filled in, but as the Assessor required this, we got it, and we would point out that the amount of

There are two items in this claim which I reject: (1) Glass Roof at back. Apparently the Landlords the Irish Transport & Workers Union are liable under their lease (copy herewith enclosed) This lease was drawn in the name of the late Landlords and was taken from 1<sup>st</sup> March 1914 for 15 years. (2) Damage to ceiling. This was caused owing to the W.C. pipe becoming choked & the water overflowing. I fail to see how this can be attributed to the Military occupation of the house as alleged. In any case the damage is very slight in fact hardly noticeable.

The other items are fair & reasonable.
