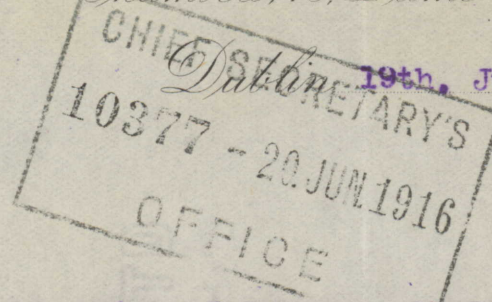

Sir,

I am instructed by Mr. Michael Bogue, a Member of the Staff of Messrs. John Egan & Co., 81 & 82 Talbot Street, Dublin, Grocers, to forward to you a claim for Six Pounds (£6.) for the loss of his bicycle during the recent disturbances.

It appears that on Easter Monday last, 24th. April, another member of the Staff took a loan of the bicycle to go on a message. He was held up by the Sinn Feiners on the North Strand Road, Dublin, and the bicycle was commandeered. My Client has made exhaustive enquiries through the Police, etc. but has been unable to find any trace of same.

Under the circumstances I trust that his claim will meet with your favourable consideration.
