Sir

In reply to your favour enclosing forms we filled in respect to application for Compensation for losses incurred during the recent disturbances. I desire to point out the Claim made was on the Military authorities for damage done to my place for premises not of the disturbances but of reason of their unnecessary smashing open the gates and other portions of the premises during the disturbances. I was absent in town and when the premises were unoccupied and this notwithstanding the fact that I had previously offered them the use of the house for the men when stationed in Clontarf during the Rebellion week. We suffered damage to several premises in the City during the Rebellion but as this was slight in comparison with that sustained by many others I had no desire to claim Compensation for the injury unless the Government provide funds sufficient to pay all.

If however your Committee desire that all Claims should be sent in I shall have same prepared
