Dear Sir,

My Committee at their Meeting to-day made a special grant of £20 to Mrs Margaret Brodie, of 77, Sotheby Road, Highbury, N.

Up to September 1915 <sup>the</sup> applicant received £100 a year, a share of rent of houses in Sackville Street, Dublin. No rent has been received since then and now the property has been totally destroyed in the recent Rebellion. Not only will Mrs Brodie not now receive the rent but she will have to pay between £80 and £100 as ground rent so that she will be absolutely penniless until the houses are rebuilt.

My object in writing to you is to ask whether you will lay these facts before the Prime Minister in the event of the Government contemplating making any compensation to those who have suffered as Mrs Brodie has through the recent Rebellion in Ireland. This case seems a particularly hard one.
