Dublin. Draper.

Occupier shop, parlour, and drawingroom of
17 North King Street at 11/6 per week. On Saturday,
29th April 1916 at about nine oclock in the morning
he and wife and four children were removed by the
military to the Technicaical Schools, Dorset Street.

On returning the following day found furniture
and bedding removed to make barricades and stock
in trade looted and destroyed.
