Dear Sir:-

re Irish Rebellion 1916.

We beg to notify you that James Connor, of Lime Works Carlow, Motor Garage Proprietor, having driven a Mr. Belton (Ammunition Worker) and party to Dublin on the 24th April, in attempting to return home was fired on in Harcourt Street, <sup>by the Rebels</sup> the bullets passing through the back of the Motor, and through Mr. Connor. He now lies in the Meath Hospital in a very serious condition, and we are instructed to claim compensation from the Treasury for the injuries sustained by him, and the damage done to the Motor Car. We would thank you to please note this claim with reference to any scheme for compensation that may be introduced by your Government.
