Claim for Damages caused during the Disturbances on the 24th April, 1916, and following days.

I Francis James Doyle now residing

at 27 Great Charles Street in the City of Dublin County of Dublin

do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare that on or about the 27th day of April

1916, damage was done to the undermentioned Property, namely:—*roof, window

front wall & fan light of the premises 27 Gt Charles St aforesaid

and also articles of jewellery as mentioned on other side

and such damage was occasioned to the best of my belief by**gun fire

from the North Circular Road direction

And I further declare that the Property and Articles specified on the other side were

so destroyed or damaged; that the Cost Price of same was as shown in each case;

specified under the head "Value of Property at time of Destruction or Damage";
