Sir,

I have been asked by Private Michael F. Duggan, 25, 972. "A" Company, 10th. Royal Dublin Fusiliers, to bring under your notice the loss which he has sustained through the burning of the premises of his Printers, Messrs. Corrigan & Wilson, No 13 Sackville Place, Dublin, during the recent disturbances. Private Duggan was the owner and Editor of a Civil Service Manual which was printed by this firm. When the fire broke out there were 1600 copies of this Manual and some photographs on the premises, all of which were totally destroyed resulting in a loss to Private Duggan of £81. The particulars of the property destroyed are as follows:-

Private Duggan I may mention took part for 8 days and nights in the suppression of the rising and unfortunately contracted pneumonia being at present confined to bed in the Royal Military Infirmary, Parkgate Street, Dublin, and unable to attend personally to his affairs he has asked me to look after his interests for him. Under the circumstances I trust that the matter will meet with your favourable consideration as the loss is a very serious one for Private Duggan.
