Sir,

I sent in a claim to the Under Secretary some days ago. I have had a reply No. 7943 on the 30th ulto., saying that you were the proper person to submit a claim. *to*

I opened my doors for the military on Friday 28th ulto., & my house was searched and some caps and uniforms were found which I was dealing in and selling to the I. N. Volunteers on account of having these things I was taken prisoner before I could lock my doors of the shops at No. 8 & 53 Mary Street, I was released on the same date and could not get back to my home. I find the sum of 35/- in cash missing from 53, Mary Street, and damage done to a door which would cost about 10/- total £2:5s.

If you are considering any claims perhaps you would kindly consider this amongst others. I only sold stuff which the law allowed and the police always knew what I sold.

*I also stocked military badges + G.R. uniforms*
