Claim No. 1355 - Andrew Furlongson.

The claim in this case is for Builders material stolen from claimants premises Hardwicke Lane Dublin. He states that the rebels entered messrs McDonnell's shop for provisions, and made off with ~~their~~ their safes to his yard where they were forced open. The premises were securely locked up on Saturday preceding Easter Monday & claimant was not able to visit the place for a fortnight, when he found the articles claimed for missing.

The articles have been in use for over 3 years & no allowance has been made for depreciation, and I think the sum of £4-0-0. would be adequate compensation.

The premises were not insured.
