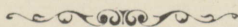

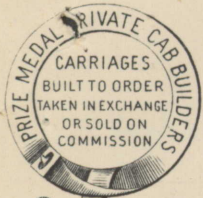

GEORGE KEYSERS STATEMENT

I reside at 19 North Cumberland Street, Dublin, and am a Car Driver. On last Easter Monday I was driving Mrs Hanlon's Car No. 59, from Fairy House Races and coming along North Circular Road near the Railway Bridge and Phibsborough Chapel, I was stopped by the "Volunteers" and myself and my three passengers were ordered to get off, the Horse was unyoked and given to me with the Harness and the Car was upturned to form part of the Barricade the "Volunteers" were making there, we were all ordered off with Revolvers pointed at us.

On the Second of May 1916, I got a Military Pass (annexed hereto) to go to the North Circular Road and get back the Car, (the Vehicle is wrongly called a "Cab" in the said pass) I got possession of the Car and subsequently left same at Messrs Sanderson's premises, 34 Lower Dominick Street, for repairs
