Dear Sir, I beg to submit particulars of my claim for losses sustained by me by reason of the burning during the recent insurrection in Dublin of the premises of Messrs. Sealy, Bryers & Walker, Printers and Publishers, Middle Abbey Street.

The stereotype plates of two of my books - "Ancient Schools & Scholars" and "Life and Writings of St. Patrick" were completely destroyed.

The cost of resetting the type of each and making new stereotype plates has been estimated at 4/6 a page.

My claim therefore is as follows:

For "Ancient Schools & Scholars":

668 pages at 4/6 a page 150. 6. 0

For "Life and Writings of St. Patrick":

766 pages at 4/6 a page 172. 7. 0

In addition, I claim £ 20 to be paid to a "Reader" for the work that will be necessary in the matter of reading and revising the proofs of these two books, as well as ^{£10.6.7} "consequent" damage for the loss of sales in the case of the second-mentioned book which is now out of print, and cannot be reprinted at present owing to destruction of the stereotype plates.

My total claim therefore is for a sum of £ 352.19.7 and I earnestly bespeak your kind attention thereto.

I fix the sum of 10.6.7 as consequent damage mentioned above as this was the net sum realised on sales of the book in question for last year and at least 12 months will have elapsed before the book can be on sale again.
