No. 1387 - Mrs. K. Haugh.

I am much obliged for yours of 6th inst. enclosing file of papers. I have gone into my notes, and think the damage assessed at £25.10/- was fair to restore the property, and I cannot recommend that the case be reopened.

The Greenhouse (timber and lattice lean to shed) was, Insured informed me when I called, in a very defective condition before the rebellion, and distinctly stated at the time that no claim was made therefor. If she had put in a claim £1 would be the utmost to which she would have been entitled for that particular item, and in going through the estimates for the other items I bore this in mind. There were one or two small articles, I believe really Servants' property, which she could also have claimed for, but I had this circumstance also in mind when assessing the damage at £25.10/-, and on the whole I think Mrs. Haugh has been very fairly treated.

Mr. Cunningham's letter referred to in hers dated 5th inst. to you is attached to the file. She apparently requires you to return this.

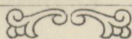

As a matter of fact there are other articles which could legitimately have been claimed for but Claimant did not consider it necessary to mention them.
