With reference to our call on your Representative early in the week, we now have pleasure in giving the particulars of our claim for property destroyed during the Rebellion:-

Plate glass windows broken on our premises as per estimate 53: 3: 7

Furniture on hire our property in possession of the Garrison

Institute, Middle Abbey Street, destroyed by fire: 180: 0: 0

X Four Mattresses taken from our Auction room 2: 13: 7

Making a total of £235: 17: 2

We may say with reference to the furniture destroyed at the Garrison Institute, that we consider the Authorities are liable to us for same, but they have instructed us to claim direct from your Committee, this we have agreed to do, having first given them notice that if our claim on your Committee was not met in full we should hold them liable for the deficiency.
