Sir,

Please take notice that during the recent Rebellion in Dublin the premises of Messrs. Maunsell & Co. Publishers &c., of 96 Middle Abbey Street, were destroyed by fire, and that certain goods, viz. 25 copies of Strickland's Dictionary of Irish Painters, the property of our clients Messrs. Hodges Figgis & Co. Ltd, of 104 Grafton Street, Dublin which were stored with Messrs. Maunsell & Co., were also destroyed by fire; that the said goods, which were portion of 50 copies purchased, were paid for by our clients Messrs. Hodges Figgis & Co. who have sustained a loss of £25.

Owing to the fact that our clients were only formally notified of their loss yesterday and that Messrs. Maunsell & Co. were not including the value of these books in their claim for compensation, they have been unable to take any steps in the matter.
