Compensation Claim Imperial Tobacco Co.,

Dear Sir,

Referring to our interview on the 14th instant, we have been in communication with our clients and have heard from them this morning on the point raised by you. They tell us that the tobacco and cigarettes in question could not be replaced by them at the same cost as at the date of the looting by reason (1) that the price of leaf tobacco has risen in America, (2) freight and insurance charges have considerably increased owing to the War, and (3) the factory employees' wages have also increased. The cost of manufacture differs on each brand both of cigarettes and tobacco; the profit varies from 5% to 10%, but, as we have already pointed out, the present cost is considerably greater than that of six months ago. The Company's staff has naturally been much depleted of late owing to so many of their employees being on active service, and it would be a matter of difficulty and entail a considerable amount of work to make out a Schedule showing the actual cost price to the Company of the particular consignments of tobacco and cigarettes at the date of the looting and the present day cost of replacing same. We trust the particulars however which we have given you will enable you to deal with T. Jameson, Esq.
