In a letter dated 19th June, we are directed by Sir Robert Chalmers to address to you any claims "in respect of the destruction to buildings or their contents during recent disturbances."

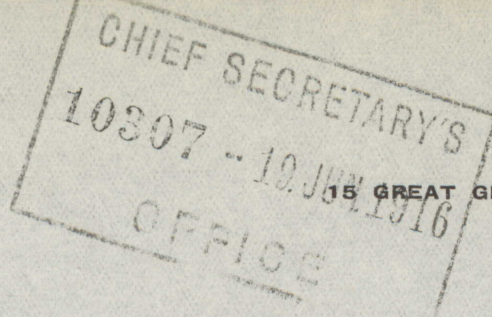

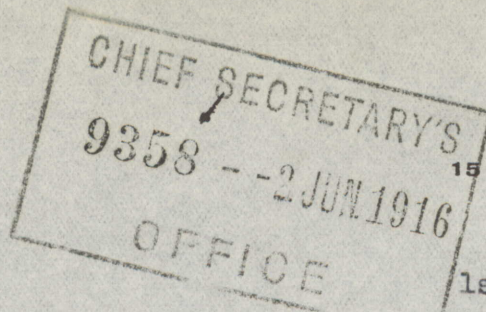
