Sir

On the 14th Inst. I received a draft from the Chief Secretary's Office for £6.16.0 in settlement of my claim for £20 on account of the loss of 2 pictures destroyed in the Exhibition of the R. Hibernian Academy last Easter. I complained of the inadequate amount offered me and I have today received the enclosed letter advising me to communicate with you — I should have sent in my claim through you in the first instance but that I am a member of the Imperial Arts League and the Secretary offered to take charge of my claim —

Mr. Charde, Second Master here, has received £17 for £35 claimed, and Wm Sheehan a pupil here, has received £12.15/- out of £17 claimed for two portrait studies, and I am at a loss to understand why I am so differently treated —

I may say that I lost the sale of one picture the 'Street at Roundstone' a local gentleman having told me he would have been

glad to purchase it if I had not lost it — in the Academy fire.

Two years ago I sold a view at Namur to Lady Art. Cairn
on the opening day of the Exhibition of the R. H. A. —

If it is possible to reopen the question of the adequacy of the
compensation awarded me I shall be very glad if you will
do so —
