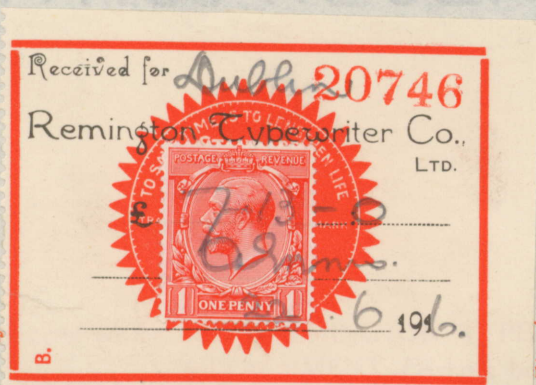


I am directed by the Council of this Society to send you the enclosed particulars of a claim by this Society for compensation in respect of damages done to their property here during the rebellion in the month of April last.
