No. 1411 - Bartholomew Jordan.

Referring to yours of the 13th ulto., I have made careful enquiries regarding Mr. Jordan's Title to the goods looted and am perfectly satisfied that he was the rightful Owner and that the declaration made on Claim Form to this effect is true and correct. The tenancy of the shop 5, Parnel Street, was in the name of Claimant's father Joseph Jordan but he had no interest in the business nor any knowledge of its working and was supported by his son Bartholomew Jordan. It is not unusual in this country, in a certain class, when the father of a family is alive for tenancies to be taken in the name of the head of the family as a mark of respect.

When I interviewed Jordan regarding his ownership of the property I did not disclose what had now raised the point but he informed me that Joseph Ford, the landlord of 5, Parnel Street, who had previously given a statement (see letter attached to the papers of the 20th December) as to the loss of goods had come to him stating that he had ascertained he had been paid his claim and demanded that he should be paid for his statement. This Jordan promptly refused to do. Ford then threatened him and subsequently seized a flitch of bacon in the premises 5, Parnel Street and when Miss Jordan remonstrated with

him he assaulted her. This is the reason that he was in prison on remand. His attitude appears to me to be one of blackmail.

I went fully into the question of Title with Mr, Edward McHugh, the Solicitor who submitted Jordan's claim and I attach a letter received from him this morning.

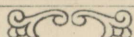
