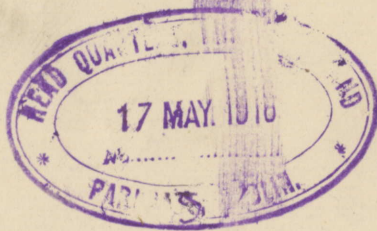

My client left the premises, handed them over to the Military, and when the latter were about to vacate them, my client went and took the place over, so that there were no outside parties in the place at all.
