Mr. Burlison of Messrs. Wm. Kavanagh & Son, Gunmakers, 12 Dame Street, has been informed by the caretaker of above Firm's premises that on 26/4/16 ^{at} ~~he~~ admitted 3 British Officers into the hall adjoining shop, and they then broke through the panel to the inside door and entered the shop; they took revolver and pistol ~~xx~~ ammunition. He says there is a revolver missing. On 28/4/16 the same two men again entered the shop, and also took ammunition on that occasion. When leaving the shop they told the caretaker that they had left a note stating what they had taken, but no note was found.

Messrs. Kavanagh & Son intend to forward a claim for the missing property to the General Officer Commanding the Forces in Ireland.

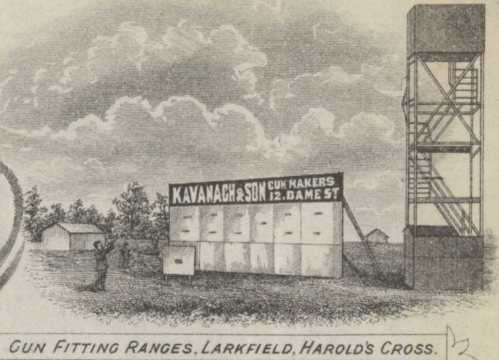
