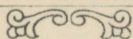

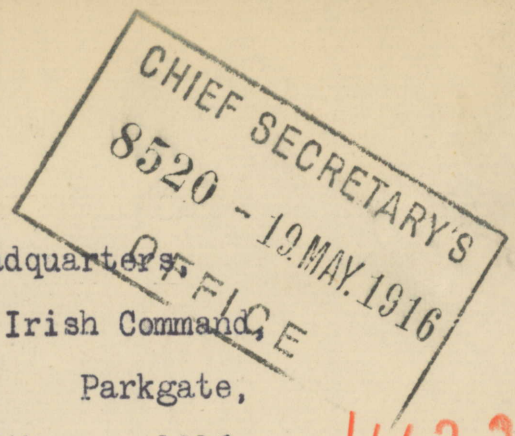

Sir,

I beg to call your particular attention to the fact that a Battery of Field Artillery encamped in one of my fields at Marino Park, Merrion Avenue, Blackrock yesterday consisting of some eighty horses and fifty men besides waggons etc, and remained for over six hours. During their stay there was incessant traffic of these waggons to and fro through my avenue, which together with their arrival and departure caused serious damage to my avenue and trees.

I have also to point out that the field occupied by them was being prepared and was considerably advanced as a meadow, but I regret to state that the condition in which it has been left prevents such an object being achieved this season. In the circumstances I must request that you will be good enough to send a Representative here at once to inspect the damage done so that no question may arise as to the compensation I feel bound to claim.

I should add that an Officer called here about 10 minutes before the Battery arrived, and upon stating that he required accommodation for a few horses, was granted the permission by my wife in my absence, my wife being under the impression that one or two horses were to be accommodated and being unable with such short notice to communicate with me owing to the Telephonic service being out of order on account of recent disturbances.

I do not wish to convey that I am not most anxious to assist the Military by every means in my humble power, neither would I have refused accommodation for a few horses

had I been here when your Officer called, but I would certainly have objected to a Battery coming within my premises and thereby depriving me of the before mentioned meadow, not to speak of the wanton damage caused to my avenue, entrance gate, railings and trees, owing so far as I can judge to the carelessness and unconcern of those in charge.

I have to add that I called at your Office this morning at 10:20 a.m., and requested the Sergeant outside the office to allow me to see Major Mold, to whom I was advised by the Metropolitan Police to explain particulars but the Sergeant in a very rough manner refused me admission directing me to wait outside in the rain, which I refused to do and therefore send this note by hand.
