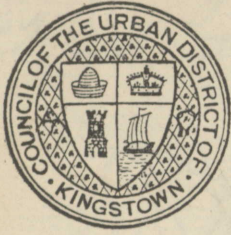

Dear Sir,

I beg to present to you an account for damage to the Technical Garden, at Eden Road Railway Bridge, Sandycove, Kingstown, incurred during its occupation by the Military (4th Leicesters) during the last fortnight. The damage was caused by the removal of soil in sandbags, the destruction of beds of plants, and the breaking of a wheelbarrow. The estimate of the damage is made by Mr John Bennett, our Instructor in Gardening, as £2.10/-
