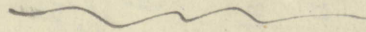



We propose to fix new sash bars in doors of Hall passage, re-glaze with amber and ruby glass where necessary and fix timber sheeting in centre panels. Re-glaze with rolled sheet glass, windows of drawingroom and provide & fix new sash weights sash cords and timber slips where necessary. To provide and fix, in existing gilded frame new silvered mirror. Re-glaze with Muranese glass centre panel of door leading from bar to back hall. Hack out and Re-glaze all broken panes in upper portion of house and repair walls of Drawing Room where broken by bullets. To repair front and side walls of house where broken by bullets, including making good of plaster work and painting as necessary including all scaffolding, materials and Workmens time for the sum of £45. 6. 8  
( Forty Five Pounds six shillings and eight pence )

We certify that in accordance with our usual monthly custom, we listed and calculated the stock in the premises of Mr. Philip Little at 106 Stephen's Green, on the 5th May 1916, and prepared a Trading a/c., in connection with same, for four weeks from April 7th. On balancing the Cash for the period we found a deficiency of £10. 10. 0 in same and a shortage in the Stock of £88. 7. 2, making a total of £98. 17. 2. As we have been in the habit of having monthly stock taken in this house for some years past, and knowing intimately the return that our client has been getting, we are in a position to state that this enormous deficiency could not possibly appear, except through looting, which we presume must have taken place during the Easter disturbances in Dublin.
