one of the first floor rooms. An es-
timate of tender, of which I can
furnish copy, for repairs amounts
to £3, but this includes some slight
matters not due to what creates
this claim, so, I expect, it may
be taken that the expense due to
it will be under three pounds.
If any other steps are presently
necessary in this connection I
shall be obliged by being informed
what they are.
