Dublin Castle

Sir

I am the Landlord of the House 2 Dolphin Terrace St. Cir. R^o in which the Rebel & Kent lived with his family - I understand the Military went up on Wednesday 26th April broke in the Hall Door and window and took possession of the premises, the family having disappeared, will you kindly let me know my position in the matter? The tenant (who I see by the evening paper, was shot this morning) owes me two months Rent - Will you make good the damage and hand me over possession so that I may let to another tenant? I presume you will not allow Kents family in again.

I wrote on the 8th inst to the Military Authorities Irish Command - informing them I was the owner of the House 2, Dolphin Terrace Sth Cir Road in which The Rebel Kent lived - When the Military went there on Wednesday April 25th - they got no answer - and broke in the Hall door and Parlour Window - I asked them to make good the damage for the next tenant & I received a reply, a copy of which I enclose. I respectfully ask will the Government make it good? Surely it would not be fair to ask me to pay who had nothing to do with the matter -
