by a Mrs. O'Reilly who vacated the premises three months after entering into occupation and prior to the Rebellion so that the house at the time - 26th April 1916 - was unoccupied. If Claimant procured a new tenant he would, of necessity, have to do some papering and painting to the house, and while Messrs. Dockrell's estimate of 443. 7. 6. is fairly reasonable for the work that must be done it should be borne in mind that the military during their occupation of the building did not do all the damage enumerated in the estimate.

The dwellinghouse claimed for in this case was taken under a three years' lease

We have pleasure in quoting for the following work -

To repair the slating on main roof, take out the badly broken slates, replace with new ones, cement point ridge thles, repair plastering on crown ceiling, supply and fix one new panel and moulding around same in Hall door, remove rubbish in connection with the above work.

For the sum of£6: 10: 0 NETT.

(Six pounds ten shillings).

Diningroom.

The walls to have the old paper stripped off, prepared and new paper hung. The windows, doors, casings and skirtings to be prepared and painted one coat and enamelled.

Drawingroom.

All the woodwork to be washed.

Return Bedroom.

The ceiling to be whitened. The walls to have new paper hung. The windows, door, casings and skirtings painted one coat.

Large Top Bedroom, Small Front Bedroom, Top Return Room.

The windows, doors, casings and skirtings to be painted one coat.

Bathroom and W.C.

The windows, doors, casings prepared and painted one coat and enamelled, inside of bath to be painted one coat and enamelled.

Hall and btaircase.

The ceilings and cornices to be prepared and whitened. The walls to be prepared and new paper hung. Balusters, stair margins

and landing to be prepared and painted one coat and enamelled The exterior of Hall door to have the old paint burned off, prepared and painted three coats and varnished. All broken glass to be reglazed. For the sum of ...£22 : 0 : 0 NETT (Twenty two pounds). Including paper for Hall and Staircase @ 1/3 per piece and Diningroom @ 1/10%. Supply new panel and molding where damaged at Hall door, also one new stairs, same as old one, painted three coats. and new scraper. For the sum of £14: 17: 6 NETT. (Fourteen pounds seventeen shillings and sixpence). SUMMARY. £6 : Repairs. 10:0 Painting etc. £22 0:0 New ladder etc.
