For several days this building was occupied by about 25 men and a number of officers, and used as their quarters. The officers included Col. Owen, Majors Morrough, Holmes, Roche-Kelly and Milner, and Capts. Taylor and O'Byrne, Lieuts. Barry. Royal and Connolly, and others of the Royal Trish Regt.

I shall be glad if you will acknowledge receipt of this claim, and kindly have same duly ranked for compensation.
