

Dear Sir,

Our Client Mr. Peter O'Brien of Glasthule Dairy, Sandycove Road, Kingstown has been referred to you by Colonel Bradley a copy of whose letter we enclose in reference to his Claim for damage done to his fields in Glenageary.

These fields which contains about 26 acres were rented by Mr. O'Brien from the 1st May last for 6 months for the purpose of grazing at the rent of £120. On the 1st May last the fields were occupied by the Artillery with the result that the constant traffic has turned a large part of them into mud and the rest has been so trampled on that they will be useless for grazing purposes during the current Season. In order to provide grazing for his cows our Client who is a Dairy man, has had to obtain other ground at a distance of four to five miles from his Dairy and this in addition to a greatly increased rent will put him to very heavy additional expense in horses, carts and labour etc., Under the circumstances he claims for the damage he has and will sustain the sum of £200 which we think you will not consider unreasonable.
