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

Head Quarters, Irish Command. I am sending herewith a letter dated 17th inst., which I have received from Miss O'Reilly, making a claim for £43:17:0, for the occupation of the Hotel and Restaurant, 46 North Wall, during the occupation by the troops during the late rebellion. The house in question is a very small one, and "Inn" would be a more correct designation than "Hotel". It was used for the storage of rations for the use of the troops at North Wall, April 24th - May 5th., and in addition, 3 or 4 officers and about 15 men slept in the house, and used it for meals etc., during the period. The Inn could not have resumed business until May 5th., as the Docks were closed until that date. I have placed opposite the figures given by the

proprietress, what I consider to be legitimate charges.
