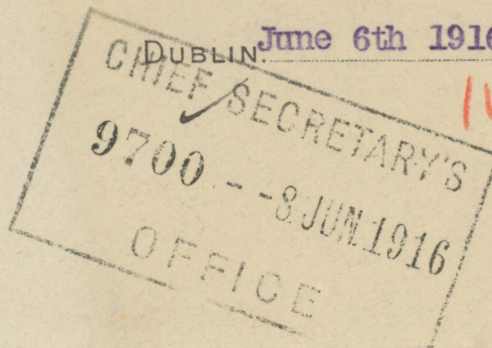

Irish Rebellion 1916.

Dear Sir:-

We beg to inform you that during the recent disturbances the shop & premises 7 Eden Quay, together with the contents, were completely destroyed and the Owner, Mr. S.J. Riordan has sustained damage to the extent of £540. and has instructed us to claim compensation from the Treasury in respect of this occurrence.

We will thank you to please note this claim with reference to any scheme which may be introduced by your Government.
