Dear Sir,

Our clients, Messrs. Robert Roberts & Co. (Ireland) Limited have instructed us that their premises at the rear of 44 Fleet Street were broken into during the recent disturbances, and goods to the value of £117. 11. 8 removed therefrom. These goods comprise tea, sugar, cakes, etc and other goods of a similar kind. At the present moment our clients have no evidence as to ^{the persons} by whom these goods were removed, and it has occurred to us that possibly they were commandeered by the Military. We shall be glad to hear from you if this is so, as in that event we presume the Government will undertake liability for payment of the goods so commandeered.²

If it would facilitate you in any way, we could supply you with details of the actual goods which are missing.

An early reply would much oblige.
