Dear Sir,

We enclose Statement of Claim for loss sustained during the recent riots. This Claim starts with the details of the purchases and the sales from the date of stocktaking, showing how same were arrived at. We then come to the stock-taking as at the 31st March, which has been taken in the ordinary way for the purpose of your Accounts and at the 13th May, when you were able to re-open.

The next Statement deals with the Claim in respect of the lost Stock, in other words applying the figures already given. We then come to the details of the various other damages sustained, all of which, so far as the business premises, etc. are concerned, we have taken from invoices, with the exception of the Furniture - £100. 13. 9 - which is an estimate made by Messrs. Arnott. The final item gives the details of the losses sustained by the assistants which were furnished by them to us.
