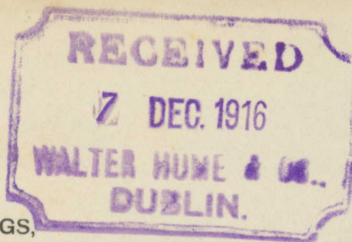

Dear Sir,

We write to apprise you that it is our intention to claim for the value of 840 (80.lbs.) Bags Sugar (approximate value £1,300.0.0.) looted from Messrs. Tedcastle McCormick & Co's Stores Sir. John Rogerson's Quay, Dublin, during the recent revolt.

These 840 Bags form part of a consignment of 1250 Bags shipped by us as follows:-

250 Bags per S.S. "Blackrock" 18th April.

1000 " " S.S. "Adela" 20th April.

consigned to Main Supply Depot, Kingsbridge Station, Dublin, for the use of His Majesty's Army, and were insured against War and Marine Risks.

A small number of the Bags have since been recovered in a damaged condition by the police and these are shortly being returned to us for re-manufacture; we expect therefore to be in a position to render a final net claim for the loss in the course of a week or so, and beg you in the meantime to take note of the particulars furnished herein.
