Craig, Gardner & Co., the Firm's Accountants, prepared Claim
from Books of the Firm, which are elaborately kept, and from
estimates of work done and to be completed to buildings. The Stock
being so much underinsured at Henry Street is accounted for by
large purchases of Sugar etc. recently from the Government and
increased cost of goods.
