Remarks

Claimant occupies the front of 89 Summerhill as dwellinghouse and Fish and Fowl Shop. The front of the building is insured by the landlord for £450 in the "Liverpool & London & Globe", but there is no damage done to this property. The Shed and Smokehouse and walls at rear have been damaged, but Claimant being only a yearly tenant is not liable for repairs, although the shed was erected by her husband without the landlord's permission. He therefore claims it as his landlord's permission. He therefore claims it as his property, and has, I understand, put forward his claim. It would appear the Sinn Feiners broke down the wall at rear to take cover in the shed, and a great portion of

the woodwork of the shed was removed for firewood by looters

Date The tenters (which are long bars of wood with hooks on which the fish are hung during the process of curing) and casks were in the Smoke-house and were also taken for firewood. Claimant is a respectable woman, and I received independent testimony as to the probable quantity of property stolen, which enables me to estimate her loss at £25.
