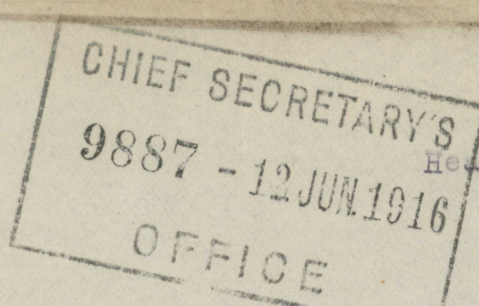

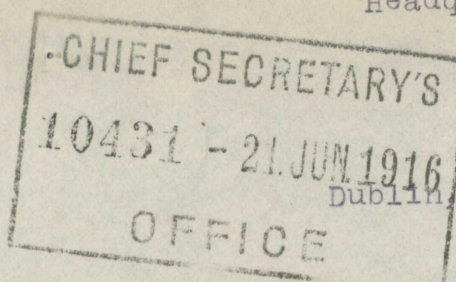

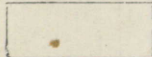

I cannot say how they were disposed of, but believe they were used for bedding for the Military Horses, inasmuch as a few of the empty bags were found by us in the end of our shed where a large quantity of Sawdust had been stored all of which was used for bedding your Horses.

After careful enquiry I have ascertained that the rocks in question are all lost, destroyed or broken, the principal cause of this being that the bonnet, which was on the line, had to be constantly moved to allow the passage of trains, many loads being lost in this way.

The heavy rain on 5th, 6th & 7th of May caused the remainder of the rocks to swell & break.

There are at present 25 sacks of oak hull in the goods yard which were not used by the troops.

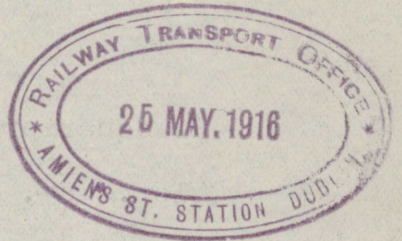
