We are making no claim for consequential loss of trade and profit, but only for our actual out of pocket expenses as above, and we are prepared to satisfy you that the amount claimed is correct.

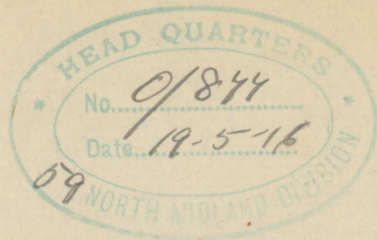



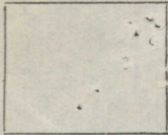
