Sir:

I enclose herewith particulars of my claim for damage ~~and~~ caused to the above premises during the recent rebellion. Through some mistake the Military in Lr. Mount St. came to the conclusion that there was a sniper in my house and opened a very heavy rifle fire and machine gun fire during Sunday the 30th of April between the hours of 9 & 12,30. Very considerable damage was also done to the house including damage to the water pipes which flooded the mortar down through the house and damaged the stair carpets. These in places were

also damaged by bullets.

Outside the house the drain pipes were also broken so that without water or drainage the house was quite uninhabitable and I had to accordingly close it up. It will be another 3 weeks before I will be able to move my family back into it. I may say that fortunately two days before I moved my wife and children out of the premises.

Should the Military Authorities wish to inspect the premises I will be pleased to meet them and to show them the several items of damage claimed.
