Sir, Claim 1586 Adam Carmichael.

In compliance with your wishes I have again gone very carefully into this claim, with a view to re-adjustment, in Claimant's favour, but in all the circumstances I have failed to find any tangible reason whereby my original recommendation of £17.5.0 could not be improved upon.

In the stress of work which prevailed at the time, and to avoid delay in dealing with this claim, I considered it in Claimant's interest to interview his Principal, Mr. Scott, Merchant Tailor, late of No 2 Lower Sackville St., who is pre-eminent in his Trade, and be guided by what he would say, which I did, and I made my recommendation, as the result, which I still consider to be fair and reasonable.

There is one item, viz. N^o 3, which I would like to draw attention to. It is a claim for £5, in respect of a "G. R." Volunteer uniform, and I happen to know that some 2 years ago a standard retail price of £2.7.6 was decided upon by the Tailoring Trade for uniforms of the kind, which would, of course, come much cheaper on claimant, as a cutter. He would, moreover, be entitled to purchase the actual material at the wholesale price.
