Dear Sir:-

I propose to execute and make good the following work  
injured at No 5 Conyngham Road. Dublin.

Strip slates and ridge tiles from roof and dormers, for  
about 10 squares, and re cover with new 24"x14" Welsh Bangor slates  
fixed to existing laths, include for undereaves, ridge tiling, etc;  
provide and fix 2 hip hooks and lay in new 5lbs lead valley gutters  
to dormers, on existing boarding, provide and set on chimney stack,  
No 3 pots set and flaunch round in cement.

Take down portion of parapet coping and provide for 9½ ft  
linl new 14"x4½" granite coping to Front bedded and pointed in cement  
cut out and replace about 27 bricks properly bedded and pointed, and  
include also for making good jamb of window at rere where injured.

Take out sashes and frame to front dormer and replace with  
new frame and pair of sashes matching existing, glazed, fitted and  
hung complete, include for trimming with architraves, and for sheeting  
sides of passages to dormers with ¾" rebated sheeting.
