After deducting the amounts claimed in respect of the four Machines referred to in the Committee's letter to the Singer Co. dated 4th November 1916, there remains a balance of £79.11.9. to be dealt with.

Interests in the buildings
The Firm have claimed the full retail price of each Machine, but this should not be allowed, as if it were it is quite clear that they would be getting a double profit out of each Machine bearing in mind that they will be replacing the various customers' Machines, and they may (the customers) will continue to pay up the retail price in accordance with their original agreement. In other words the Claimants are only entitled to claim the actual out-of-pocket expenses in re-producing the burnt Machines, and this I have clearly pointed out to the Claimants. I have accordingly deducted 25% from the balance above referred to, and recommend my valuation as fair and reasonable compensation.


